PUBLIC HEALTH ENGLAND LAUNCHES 'CERVICAL SCREEENING SAVES LIVES' CAMPAIGN

On Tuesday 5 March 2019, Public Health England (PHE), launched the major new national campaign 'Cervical Screening Saves Lives', to increase the uptake of women attending for cervical screening across England.

The campaign encourages women to respond to their cervical screening invitation letter, and if they missed their last screening, to book an appointment at their GP practice.

Around 2,600 women are diagnosed with cervical cancer in England each year, and around 690 women die from the disease- 2 deaths every day. It is estimated that if everyone attended screening regularly, 83% of cervical cancer cases could be prevented.

Regular screening, which only takes a few minutes, can help stop cervical cancer before it starts, as the test identifies potentially harmful cells before they become cancerous, and ensures women get the right treatment as soon as possible.

In support of this campaign and to encourage as **many women as possible** to attend for cervical screening, Much Wenlock and Cressage Medical Practice, in addition to the facility to book an appointment within the normal working week, will be offering dedicated evening cervical screening Nurse clinics between 5pm and 7pm at Much Wenlock Medical Practice on the following dates:

- Thursday 9 May
- Tuesday 14 May
- Wednesday 22 May
- Wednesday 29 May

We will be sending out invitations to those patients due a cervical smear, however if you are not sure whether you are eligible and have not received an invitation please contact the Practice and we will check your records.
